The TIMES Center is a non-for-profit organization a program of the Mental Health Center of Champaign County... The original men’s shelter was housed for 16 years at McKinley Presbyterian Church, before the TIMES Center opened its doors on February 14, 2000 to serve homeless men of Champaign County.

Today we serve as a men’s Transitional Living Facility. Empowering men through structured programming and support services to transition to independent living.



The TIMES Center is comprised of three programs;

Transitional Level I

Transitional Level II

Soup Kitchen

All homeless men are welcome, regardless of race, religion, creed, color, disability, national origin, age, veteran status, sexual orientation or those in any other protected class. All residents, however, must be able to meet the TIMES Center life safety policy requirements.
